The Michigan State Board of Nursing has granted initial approval to Alma College to offer a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree.

Alma College has never offered a B.S.N. degree in its long and illustrious history.

The new degree program has been in the planning stages for at least 2 years. It could not be publicized until now, because the State Board of Nursing had not yet given its approval. Judith McKenna, who holds a doctorate in Nursing Practice will head the program. Judith comes to Alma College from the University of Detroit Mercy where she was an assistant professor.

A Different Program

Alma College nursing students will be integrated into the regular student body and through much of their education won't be attending isolated nursing classes.

Alma's students will take courses in English, Art, Sociology and Communications, Political Science and of course Chemistry, Biology and Math.

Alma College's contemporary nursing education which will grant a four year degree in nursing science prepares these young men and women to communicate, problem solve, think critically and become highly educated members of their profession and extremely valuable to future employers.
